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1. Overview of Operating Results and Others

(1) Overview of Operating Results

During the semi-annual period ended September 30, 2025, the Japanese economy maintained its gradual recovery trend, supported by improvements in corporate income, the employment and income environment, and the effects of various government policies. However, uncertainties remain regarding the future economic outlook. These include the potential effects of U.S. trade policy, escalating resource and energy costs due to ongoing conflicts in Ukraine and the Middle East, and worsening labor shortages. In the construction industry, which is the Asanuma Group's main business, public construction investment remains steadily driven by the continued demand for the renewal of aging infrastructure. Although private sector residential investment stagnated due to a backlash against the surge in demand seen in the previous fiscal year, which was driven by the mandatory compliance with energy efficiency standards, private sector non-residential investment continues to show a steady overall construction investment trend, driven by strong corporate capital investment sentiment. However, the business environment remains severe due to persistently high material prices, worsening labor shortages, and stricter working-hour regulations, all of which pose challenges in securing adequate construction capacity.

Under such conditions, the Group has entered the second year since launching "The Three-Year Medium-Term Plan (FY2024-FY2026)."

We have selected six key themes on which to focus over the next three years. For one of these themes, "DX Promotion," we are providing DX training to all employees. The goal of this training is to enhance DX literacy among all employees, foster awareness, and cultivate personnel capable of driving DX initiatives. Through this training, we are building the foundation to accelerate transformation within the Company. Moving forward, we will strive to further promote DX to increase operational efficiency and productivity, and to establish a sustainable management foundation. Also, with respect to "contribution to the environment and society," we have been working to calculate GHG (greenhouse gas) emissions according to stricter standards aligned with the GHG Protocol calculation standards starting in FY2023. With respect to the GHG emissions calculation results for FY2024, we have obtained third-party assurance to enhance reliability. For FY2025, we plan to set more ambitious reduction targets and obtain Science Based Targets (SBT) certification. Moving forward, the Group will continue to strengthen its efforts to address environmental issues, including climate change, and fulfill its corporate responsibility toward realizing a sustainable society.

With respect to other measures, we will continue implementing each initiative to ensure the plan is achieved within the remaining two years. Amid a diverse and changing business environment, we will accurately identify management issues and strive for sustainable growth and medium-to-long-term enhancement of corporate value with all executives and employees united as one.

As a result of the above, we recorded orders received of \(\frac{\pman}{132,731}\) million (increased by 69.2% year on year) during the six months ended September 30, 2025, net sales of \(\frac{\pman}{86,875}\) million (increased by 21.1% year on year), and gross profit of \(\frac{\pman}{10,026}\) million (increased by 28.5% year on year).

Operating income was \(\frac{4}{341}\) million (increased by 50.5% year on year).

Ordinary income was \(\frac{4}{4},421\) million (increased by 50.9% year on year).

As a result of the above, semi-annual net income attributable to owners of the parent was \\ \frac{\frac{1}}{3},070 \text{ million} \) (increased by 66.1% year on year).

(Civil Engineering)

Orders received were \(\frac{\pma}{2}\)1,035 million (increased by 299.7% year on year), sales were \(\frac{\pma}{13,398}\) million (increased by 38.5% year on year), and segment income was \(\frac{\pma}{1}\),598 million (increased by 36.5% year on year).

In the "Others" segment, net sales were \$1,752 million (increased by 12.2% year on year), and segment income was \$353 million (increased by 52.4% year on year).

(2) Overview of Financial Position

Status of assets, liabilities and net assets

(Assets)

Current assets decreased 3.9% from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to ¥93,815 million. This was mainly due to the progress in the collection of receivables, resulting in a decrease of ¥2,445 million in notes receivable, accounts receivable from completed construction contracts and a decrease of ¥3.550 million in accounts receivable-other.

Fixed assets increased 0.7% from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to \fomega17,699 million. This was primarily due to a \footnote{7}18 million increase in investment securities and other assets.

As a result, total assets decreased 3.2% from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to \footnote{111,515} million.

(Liabilities)

Current liabilities decreased 10.3% from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to \(\frac{\pmathbf{44}}{458}\) million. This was due to an increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\),012 million in advances received on construction contracts in progress, while accounts payable for construction contracts decreased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\),887 million and short-term borrowings were reduced by \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\),310 million.

Non-current liabilities increased 2.2% from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to \\$16,580 million. This was mainly due to an increase of \\$433 million in long-term borrowings.

As a result, total liabilities decreased 7.3% from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to \(\frac{4}{64},038 \) million.

(Net Assets)

Total net assets increased by 2.9% compared to the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year, reaching \quantum 47,476 million. This was due to factors such as the recording of profit attributable to owners of parent and the payment of dividends, resulting in an increase in retained earnings of \quantum 975 million.

Status of cash flows

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities for the semi-annual consolidated fiscal period was \$9,120 million (compared to a net increase of \$7,422 million in the same period of the previous year). This was mainly due to a decrease in accounts receivable-other and an increase in advances received on construction contract in progress.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Net cash used in investing activities for the semi-annual consolidated fiscal period was ¥571 million (compared to a net decrease of ¥299 million in the same period of the previous year). This was primarily due to expenditures for the payments into time deposits, the purchase of property, plant and equipment and intangible fixed assets.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Net cash used in financing activities for the semi-annual consolidated fiscal period was \(\frac{1}{2}\)6,764 million (compared to a net decrease of \(\frac{1}{2}\)10,440 million in the same period of the previous year). This was mainly due to the repayment of short-term borrowings and the payment of dividends.

[Qualitative Information on Individual Orders Received Results]

During the six months ended September 30, 2025, individual order performance increased by 70.6% year-on-year to ¥128,025 million. By segment, both the building construction and civil engineering divisions saw an increase in orders from public and private sectors.
